February 2010

Dear Friends in Christ,

Even though our city was not severely affected by the earthquake, the devastation in the capital has been felt country wide. Seventy thousand refugees came to the Gonaives area, and many injured from the quake have overwhelmed the hospitals in our city. We are trying to minister to these victims as well as continue our church-planting ministry involving evangelism, discipleship, and training national pastors. We are grateful for so many who have donated to help Haiti at this time, but we especially thank you for your prayers.

In December we had a blessed service where four of our Bible school graduates were ordained for the ministry. We are working with all four of these men to establish local churches.

On February 14, the first Sunday service was held at our new work in the city of Saint Michel. Wilson Young is the man God has called to build this local church. He was saved through our ministry. He graduated from the Bible school and will graduate from the seminary in March. There were well over 100 in attendance for this service, and there have already been ten salvation decisions due to Pastor Young's evangelistic efforts.

We are half way through this session of our Bible school where we are teaching Eschatology, the Gospel of John, the Local Church Ministry, and the Book of Romans.

The walls for the building in Petite Place were erected in December. The same is being done at MaLouise even as this letter is being written. We also plan to do this at Deklen in March.

The church at Pascot has called a pastor.

Please continue to pray for land for the work at Ka Georges.

Our grandson, Joel Allen, is showing no signs of having been premature. He has filled out quite well. Thank you for your prayers for him.
